ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

St. Vincent de Paul was born to a poor peasant family in the French village of Pouy on April 24, 1581. His first formal education was provided by the Franciscans and he was ordained in 1600. In 1605, while on a ship traveling from Marseilles to Narbone, he was captured, brought to Tunis and sold as a slave. Two years later he and his master managed to escape and both returned to France.

St. Vincent went to Avignon and later to Rome to continue his studies. While there he became a chaplain to the Count of Goigny and was placed in charge of distributing money to the deserving poor. He became pastor of a small parish in Clichy for a short period of time, while also serving as a tutor and spiritual director.

From that point forward he spent his life preaching missions and providing relief to the poor. He even established hospitals for them. He later extended his concern and ministry to convicts. The need to evangelize and assist these souls became so great that he founded the Ladies of Charity, a lay institute of women, as well as a religious institute of priests - the Congregation of Priests of the Mission, commonly referred to now as the Vincentians.
